### Road works

Anyone who drives out of the village will have noticed that we are surrounded by road works: flood recovery resurfacing works (Blackhorse Road, to end of February), installation of telecom ducts and chambers (Dawney Hill and up to Pirbright tunnel, due to end 22 February; Gole Road to golf club entrance, 21 February to 1 March; night works around the crossroads, 23 to 28 February), resurfacing on Guildford Road in Bisley continues to end March, highway maintenance and drainage works (Prey Heath Road, to 13 March), sewer and water works (Vicarage Road in Woking, to end of May), new water supply (Mill Lane in Pirbright, 2 to 5 March). No doubt the results will be worth the frustration, but I do wonder why the roads that were beautifully resurfaced

before Christmas are all being dug up again now?

# SURREY HALF MARATHON

## Sunday 8 March

More than 4000 runners will be racing in the second Surrey Half Marathon, which starts from Woking Leisure Centre at 9.00am. The race is now closed for runners but do go along to cheer on the runners and give them your support. The route passes the Christmas Bakery at Fox Corner, where there is a spectator hotspot, then goes along Berry Lane – there is a water station at Noah's Ark Nursery – then a little way up Blackhorse Lane and into Saunders Lane. If you want to see the start and finish you will need to take

the train or park in Woking town centre as the Leisure Centre car parks will be closed. The first runner is expected back just after 10am. There is also a 1.5km kids' race starting at 9.25am.

Many of the runners will be raising money for charity including Andy Coe (mentioned last month) who is supporting Woking Hospice, and local postman Paul Newman. Paul is band leader of the Cadence Drum and Bugle Corps, three American style marching bands with over 100 members, including children from Brookwood and Pirbright. They give

## VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO HELP TRAIN ASSISTANCE DOGS FOR CANINE PARTNERS



The national charity Canine Partners is seeking dog lovers to take puppies into their own homes and begin their early training to be assistance dogs for people with disabilities.

The charity, which trains assistance dogs to give disabled people more confidence and independence, has launched a new group at Brookwood Memorial Halls every Wednesday between 12pm and 1pm.

'Puppy parents' take a pup into their home from the age of eight weeks until they are 12–14 months old, and need to have time, commitment, a sense of humour, and be able to attend a regular training class in Brookwood. They teach the assistance-dogs-in-training basic obedience, social skills and core tasks

that are essential before they move on to advanced training, where their skills are refined specifically for a disabled person's needs. Previous experience with dogs is not required, but a puppy parent will need to be home most of the day, have a secure dog-friendly garden, enjoy the fun of classes and outings, and have the stamina to manage an active young puppy. Canine Partners will provide food and equipment for the puppy, and cover all veterinary costs for the duration of the puppy parent relationship.

Canine Partners provides specially trained assistance dogs to help people with disabilities carry out everyday tasks they find difficult, painful or impossible to do for themselves.

Wendy Ireland, from Surrey, 46, has hypermobility syndrome and relies on her canine partner Mia. She said: 'At home Mia helps get me undressed for a shower or ready for bed, she finds and gets my shoes, opens doors, gets the telephone, picks up the many things I drop, gets the post, takes the washing from the machine, puts the footplates down on my wheelchair, and helps with my physiotherapy by letting me

groom and stroke her. If I take a turn for the worse she can alert my son or personal assistant, pass my emergency button pendant or press the Careline emergency call button. I now look to the future without fear or worry.'

## BRAND NEW FITNESS CLASSES – STARTING IN MARCH



## NEWS FROM BROOKWOOD AND BRIDLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD FORUM (BBNF)



The Committee of the Neighbourhood Forum has written a summary report providing an insight into the results from the area-wide questionnaire that was distributed in October. This has produced some interesting results which will drive the direction of the Neighbourhood Forum from here. Briefly:

- 94% of respondents were very satisfied or satisfied with the area as a place to live.
- 97% of respondents thought it important to retain the BROOKWOOD VILLAGE CENTRE, with shops and other commercial units.
- On PERSONAL SAFETY AND SECURITY, 94% felt safe and secure when at home. When walking the streets in the area, 91% felt safe and secure.
- On PARKING, only 41% were satisfied or very satisfied with parking provision for residents and local businesses.
- TRANSPORTATION, TRAFFIC AND PARKING ISSUES attracted the highest number of individual comments.
