## COUNCIL PROPOSALS FOR GREEN BELT DEVELOPMENT

Woking Borough Council has initiated a consultation period on future planning for the borough. The strategic document is widely known as 'Woking 2027' and consultation is taking place until the end of July. As far as Brookwood is concerned there are two main issues:

The proposed extension of the traveller site at Five Acres on Brookwood Lye Road (GB2 and GB3 on the map)

The proposal to develop the defunct Coblands Nursery site next to the traveller site (GB1 on the map)

The Brookwood and Bridley Neighbourhood Forum (BBNF) is making representations to the Council on both issues. Briefly, BBNF opposes the first proposal on the grounds that the current site at Five Acres is now at capacity, having 15 pitches which is the maximum number recommended by Government guidelines and the Council's own policy. The Council is proposing to put additional pitches on the area marked GB3, which it argues is a separate site. The BBNF points out


that the two areas, which adjoin, are essentially one site with one entrance.

With regard to Coblands, the Council proposes to develop this land in the period 2022–27. BBNF agrees that it should be developed and sees no need to wait until 2022. The Forum urges the Council to give permission for one- and two-bedroomed homes, including some affordable housing, to be built on this land. It is also asking the Council to examine carefully the effect of yet more traffic at the Brookwood crossroads.

## NEW CAR PARKING AT THE STATION IN 2016

It has been confirmed that an additional 100 car parking spaces will be made available at Brookwood station next year. This will be achieved by means of a single-storey elevation running the length of the car park along the side of the railway line and extending halfway across the existing car park.

James Beveridge, station manager for Aldershot, says, 'We recognise that there is a demand for an increased number of car parking spaces at a number of locations on the South West Trains network.

South West Trains has recently signed an agreement with the Department for Transport to deliver an additional 1400 car parking spaces in the next 18 months. This will be achieved by building 8 single-storey decked car parks at selected locations. Brookwood is one of the stations being considered under this scheme. Further information will be made available to customers as the schemes progress.'

Tony Burley, the ticket clerk at the station, is constantly turning away customers because of car parking issues and welcomes the news.

It is likely that the work will take up to six months and will start from February/March of next year. During that time the car park will be closed and customers who usually travel from Brookwood will be allowed to travel from neighbouring stations.

There are two issues which arise from this development – the visual impact and the increase in traffic. Network Rail (NR) has assured Woking Borough Council that the structure will not be visible to homes backing on to the car park along Connaught Road, which are presently screened by a very high hedge owned by NR.

If an additional 100 cars are using the car park, there are likely to be 200 extra car movements each working day and

queues at both ends of Connaught Road will be longer. But it seems there is little we can do about it.

Cllr Kevin Davis advocates a pragmatic approach. He says, 'The reality of the planning situation is that NR has Permitted Development rights within the area of the station, in the same way that residents usually have Permitted Development rights. This means that they are able to make the changes without having to bring forward a planning application.

Many of us who live nearby will be automatically opposed to the proposals, the primary reason being that there is no benefit to Brookwood, only pain. I don't think you are wrong. However as NR has Permitted Development rights we already know we hold a losing hand. Woking Borough Council can't stop it, Surrey County Council can't stop it, our MP can't stop it. Pleading with NR via a petition isn't going to stop it. I believe we need to work with NR to try and get some concessions.'

Kevin is hoping that NR will consider improving access to platform 2 for buggies and wheelchair users, and also look at reversing the entry and exit points at the station which should help traffic flow around the centre of the village.
