## The Station

It looks likely that the new car parking facilities will be installed later than originally thought. There appears to be a 3-month delay on the whole project, so currently it is unlikely that work will begin at Brookwood until May/June. We will keep you posted.

## Accidents

How many letters have we printed in the past year warning about the danger of accidents at the exit of the station? Sadly, they were right. In the ten day period at the end of November/first week of December three motorcyclists were knocked down by motorists leaving the station in the rush hour. Fortunately, to our knowledge, none have been seriously hurt. But it does underline the danger of heavy traffic in a confined area with impaired sight-lines. Both Cllr Kevin and the manager

of the line are looking into it. In the meantime, please take care if you are a commuter leaving the station in the dark.

## Travellers

You may have seen Cas Halls' piece in the Woking News and Mail recently questioning why the number of travellers on Brookwood Lye is set to be increased. It seems the short answer is that other councillors do not want them in their wards. At present we have 15 legal pitches and not four but six illegal ones. Cllr Kevin has asked the Council repeatedly to remove the illegal ones. So far the Council has failed to act. It seems the plan is to move yet more people on to the site, almost doubling the current numbers. Why? Not because it is right or in anyone's interest but because it is politically convenient.

It is nothing less than scandalous that these poor ponies have been left on Brookwood Lye. The land is wet and strewn with rubbish; no way can it be deemed healthy. Yet it seems that no one can do anything to help them. So frustrating.
