BROOKWOOD AND BRIDLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD FORUM UPDATE

Thanks to all who returned the latest questionnaire; we had a good response rate of around 50%. We are analysing the detailed replies to our suggested aims and will prepare a summary report shortly. Overall, the responses suggest that the issues raised and questions asked were the right ones. Many interesting comments have been made, demonstrating how strongly you feel about your village community. The next steps will be to develop proposals for how to meet some of those aims, and to create a valid and worthwhile Neighbourhood Plan. We'll also have some subjects that people feel strongly about that are not planning related but require some form of lobbying, which is another role the Forum will undertake.

ALL CHANGE!

In May, the Brookwood ward will cease to exist and Brookwood will be wrapped up into the new Heathlands Ward, the largest ward in the borough, which will include Barnsbury, Hook Heath, Mayford and Sutton Green. It will be interesting times following the local elections for the three new ward councillors, and potentially a diverse and challenging area to look after.
