

VANDALISM ON THE CANAL

It's lovely to have a garden which backs onto the canal, but we returned from holiday on Friday (19 August) to find that we'd had some very unwelcome intruders. Vandals had come into the garden and stolen the rowing boat that we keep tied up next to the water. They took it a few hundred metres down the canal, then smashed a hole in it, turned it over and tried to sink it. I found it capsized and half-submerged in the middle of the channel. Our friends in the village say they spotted 'kids in hoodies' on the boat on Tuesday (16 August) and called the Police, but I'm not aware of any arrests. I have since retrieved the boat and will have to now try to make some repairs to it. I've also strengthened the perimeter fencing to try to prevent any repeat of the intrusion into our garden.

Meanwhile, please can residents keep a watchful eye out for such vandals and report any suspicious activity to the Police.

EDITORIAL

Welcome to the September issue of the Brookwood newsletter. Things have quietened down a bit in the village after the summer events around the Queen's



birthday. There doesn't seem to be much activity on the old Wesson site. However, the station improvements seem to be nearing completion (more on that later).

There has been a fair bit of movement on the canal over the summer. I have seen a number of barges going up and down through the Brookwood stretch, and reports of more to come. Now the evenings are starting to draw in it's a great time for any budding or ageing naturalist to get out and do a bit of bat spotting. The canal and ponds on the heath provide bats with the water to rehydrate – and they also attract midges and other flying insects, which congregate in their thousands and provide a ready feast for bats. The trees on the woodland's edge and their associated shrubbery attract a wide variety of insects for bats to prey on as well. These open linear stretches allow the bats to feed safely and travel between roosts. They're a bit like a bat motorway and service station.

More good news on the wildlife front – the young swift that was rescued and reported in last month's newsletter was successfully released last week from the animal hospital in Leatherhead.


