Many of you will know that Tim Benson passed away on 23 March aged 69. He was the much-loved husband of Chris, and father to his two girls, Holly and Ashley. Tim was born in West Ewell and moved to Heath Drive, when he and Chris were first married, nearly 40 years ago. He was a BT Counsellor and Welfare Officer and, after taking early retirement, worked as a Home Start Charity Organiser, visiting referred families and training volunteers. His strong Christian faith meant that he was a huge part of St Saviour's Church, and over the years ran the Sunday School and Youth Club, and led many services and other events at the church. He began and led the ReGeneration Team, which has recently been updating the church facilities, and initiated the 'outreach' to the village and community through concerts and other events. His memorial service was held at St Saviour's on 11 April and was attended by over 200 people. Chris would like to thank everyone who came that day, and for all their good wishes and support.

I now know why I never became a journalist! Brian Blessed recounted his experiences of serving for his country and of a fellow soldier who died in his arms. He also expressed how important the exhibition is in reminding us of the history and sacrifices that were made by so many for our country. The exhibition is free, open 7 days a week from 10am to 4pm, and well worth a visit!

TULIPS FROM CANADA

This spring, the maple leaf has become an even more familiar sight in the Canadian plot at CWGC Brookwood Military Cemetery. Dozens of special tulip bulbs have successfully bloomed for the first time amid the headstones, displaying the red and white of the Canadian flag, including the red central maple leaf. The bulbs were donated in January as a centenary gift to the CWGC from the Canadian High Commission in London. As part of Canada's 150th anniversary this year, Dutch growers developed a new tulip - the Canada 150 - which blossoms with white leaves and red flames, looking remarkably similar to the country's maple leaf flag. Although the tulips are mostly finished now, we will be able to look out for them for many more springs to come.

A plot in the west corner of the cemetery contains approximately 2,400 Canadian graves of the Second World War including those of 43 men who died from wounds following the Dieppe Raid in August 1942.

The Canadian Records building, which was a gift of the Canadian government in 1946, houses a reception room for visitors and other offices, and currently the exhibition until November.



HALL FOR HIRE

We are very lucky to have three halls in Brookwood, two of which are used almost continuously for all kinds of activities (the large and small Memorial Halls are superbly run by volunteers in the village). St Saviour's church hall has been looking very tired in recent years but, thanks to recent local fund raising and other sources, it is having a face-lift. New double-glazed windows, blinds and wall panels are due to be fitted soon, and will improve the insulation and look of the hall, while research is being done to install a suspended ceiling with LED lighting. This will also help the acoustics. Redecoration will be carried out by volunteers during the summer holidays.
