MACMILLAN COFFEE MORNINGS ON FRIDAY 15 SEPTEMBER


You have a choice of Coffee Mornings, or you could do both!

FANY TRAINING AT BROOKWOOD



The First Aid Nursing Yeomanry (FANY) was founded in 1910 as a voluntary organisation to provide highly mobile nursing support to the British Army. The members were required to have good riding skills in addition to first aid. To develop these skills, training camps were held two or three times a year at various locations in Surrey. Although not a formal unit within the Army, the FANYs received support from the Royal Army Medical Corps (RAMC) for their first aid training, and from the Brigade of Guards (both the Royal Horse Guards and the 19th Hussars) for their camp facilities and equestrian training.

In 1913, their summer camp was held at Goal Farm and the house, which still exists, is visible in their picture with the railway embankment in the background (with very few trees in those days). So they were camped on what was until recently part of the nine-hole golf course.

A new recruit, Pat Beauchamp, describes her arrival as follows 'Arrived at Brookwood, I chartered an ancient fly and in about twenty minutes or so espied the camp in a field some distance from the road along which we were driving. "Ard up for a job I should say!" said my cabby, nodding jocosely towards the khaki figures working busily in the distance. I ignored this sally as I dismissed him and set off across the fields with my suit case.

There was a large mess tent, a store tent, some half dozen or more bell tents, a smoky, but serviceable-looking field kitchen, and at the end of the field were tethered the horses!' Extract from Fanny Goes To War by Pat Beauchamp (1919, reprinted Echo Library 2005).

In 1914, just before the start of the war, their summer camp was again held 'at Pirbright' but the precise location is unknown (but there are more trees than at Goal Farm). Interestingly, we have been told that one of the overgrown fields at the western edge of Sheets Heath is known as Fanny's Field, so perhaps this was their camp site (do you know?).

With the start of the war, the FANYs went on to become the first women's corp to serve in Belgium and France, providing both hospital and transport services. During the First World War FANYs were awarded 17 Military Medals, 27 Croix de Guerre, one Legion d'Honneur and 11 Mentions in Despatches.

The FANYs still exist today. HRH The Princess Royal is their Commandant in Chief. Since 1999, when Her Royal Highness gave permission to use her title, the Corps has been renamed: FANY (Princess Royal's Volunteer Corps), commonly abbreviated to: FANY (PRVC). 
St Saviour's ReGeneration team is delighted to announce two forthcoming concerts to be held in the church this autumn.
