REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Every year we remember with gratitude, pride and no little sadness the courage and the sacrifice made by so many people in the First World War and in conflicts since then. This year is the Centenary of the Armistice and it coincides with Britain's Remembrance Sunday. There will be a Remembrance Service at St. Saviour's Church on Sunday 11 November, which will include communion, commencing at 10am and concluding with the minute's silence at 11am. If any organisations wish to attend and/or lay wreaths they are very welcome to do so but it would be helpful if they could inform Revd. Remembrance ceremonies will also take place in the UK, Canadian and German sections of Brookwood Military Cemetery, which are open to the public. Limited parking at Brookwood means visitors may be directed instead to the train station, which is a short walk from the cemetery. The Commonwealth exhibition housed in the Canadian Records Building continues and Sunday tours are being hosted until Christmas (see www.cwgc.org for details).

BROOKWOOD CEMETERY RECEIVES NATIONAL RECOGNITION

In October Brookwood Cemetery won Gold in the Large Cemetery category at the prestigious National Cemetery of the Year Awards, for its high industry standards and good practice.

Philip Potts of the Memorial Awareness Board, promoters and organisers of the Cemetery of the Year Awards for nearly 20 years, said: "The team at Brookwood Cemetery performed exceptionally throughout the extensive judging period which is focused on industry standards, good practice and freedom of choice."

Since December 2014, the Council has implemented an extensive restoration programme, including removing vegetation, returning previously overgrown areas of the cemetery to use, building a new mausoleum and creating a landscaped Garden of Remembrance and an additional 100 burial plots featuring carefully selected trees and shrubs, including a specimen Cedar of Lebanon, that reflects the historic nature of the Grade 1 listed cemetery. The cemetery lake has also been rebuilt and extensive improvements made to the office and public facilities. Currently works are ongoing to replace sections of the historic perimeter wall.

BROOKWOOD SCHOOL

When Ofsted visited Brookwood School early in September staff and pupils were thrilled to show the inspection team the fantastic work that happens every day. They were very proud that the inspectors recognised the real strengths in the way that the children learn and behave. The team noted that the pupils behaved "impeccably", were "extremely tolerant and respectful of each other" with "impressive maturity". Ofsted's report, which can be read in full on the school's website (www.brookwood.surrey.sch.uk) also noted the "skilful teaching" and "interesting and varied curriculum" which "successfully stimulates pupils' learning".

Parents considering Brookwood for their child's first 'big' school are encouraged to contact the School to arrange a visit. The Reception intake for 2019 will be open for children who will be 5 years old between 1 September 2019 and 31

August 2020. The website contains a list of pre-planned dates for a tour of the school, but other times may be available.

The Christmas Fair will be held on Friday 7 December from 3.15pm. As well as a variety of games for younger visitors there will be Tombolas, a BBQ, cakes and refreshments. There are a number of external stallholders coming, so a great opportunity to get your Christmas shopping done. NEWS FROM COUNCILLOR KEVIN DAVIS

Woking Borough Council's latest Site Allocations Development Plan Document (SADPD) was approved in October and the proposals will now be submitted to an inspector for approval.

My on-line blog explains in detail the SADPD process. For Brookwood, there are no proposals for the 2027 – 2040 period so we can expect no development other than minor changes to the already built area.

The treatment of the Five Acres site was rather devious in the original SADPD in 2016, with officers considering doubling the number of authorised pitches to around 30. I campaigned ferociously against this disgraceful plan and achieved some significant victories.

Even now, Five Acres has 13 authorised permanent pitches, and two temporary pitches, although they are currently not in the location that planning permission has been granted for.

The proposals for Traveller accommodation at Five Acres in the latest SADPD are for an increase from the current 15 pitches to 19 pitches, an increase of 4 overall. There will likely be an additional transit pitch allowing some flexibility for visitors to legally visit.

This appears to be the best outcome that could have been achieved for Brookwood and is approximately 11 fewer than had previously been suggested. The planning application for these 19 pitches is currently making its way through the system. The Planning Department is dragging its heels on the illegal pitches on the back of the site but now with the publication of the SADPD, they will struggle to justify doing nothing about it.

ST SAVIOUR'S CHURCH – 10 MESSY YEARS

10 years, 110 celebrations, 786 different crafts and activities, over 700 different visitors, 75 volunteers. There was much to celebrate at St Saviour's as they looked back over 10 amazing years of this incredibly fun way of growing in faith together as families.

Messy Church was developed for those families who were unable to commit to coming along to church every single week or for whom Sunday was often the day for family visits and activities. They meet on the second Saturday of every month between 3.30pm and 5.30pm. Every month, Messy Church @ St Saviour's has around 8 different activities in the first hour – ranging from edible crafts, science experiments, collaborative art, team games, creative ways of praying, sculpting, junk modelling, slime making....you name it, they've done it! The afternoon is rounded off with a delicious tea for everyone down in the hall.

So, if you're new to the area or if you've heard of Messy Church but haven't popped in for a visit yet,



why not come along on Saturday 10 November? Messy Church will be in the newly refurbished hall to the rear of the church, taking Remembrance as the theme in their own Messy way; at the same time, take a look at the exhibits in the WW1 Exhibition in the Church.


