LOCAL SPORTING SUPERSTAR!



James and Rachel have both been Brookwood residents for the last 10 years, having met 18 years ago at a Savate kickboxing class in Guildford. They run a French kickboxing 'Savate' club in Farncombe and compete on a national and international scale.

Savate (pronounced Suh-vat) is a kickboxing sport that has its roots in 19th century French fighting styles. It is a fast paced and accurate form of combat – a mixture of French kicking and English boxing. The strikes are taught to be precise, effective and fluid.

Rachel came back to competing in the

London Open in June, having given birth to their second child in January, winning both of her fights against English and French competitors.

After winning the British Championships in May, James trained hard all year to compete in the World Savate Assault Competition in October this year in Bulgaria. He won both of his pool fights in the first two days of the competition to get through to the semi-finals on the third day. He fought hard, but just lost out to the French fighter by a split decision, with James going on to win the Bronze (James is on the left in the photo).

CHURCH HALL IMPROVEMENTS



Over the past year, volunteers and professionals have spent many hours working on St Saviour's Hall improving the facilities with a new kitchen, double-glazed windows and new flooring. However, the acoustics and old fluorescent lighting remained a financial problem until, we are delighted to say, a grant from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund was obtained to put in a new acoustic, thermal ceiling with LED lighting. The grant is given to help local youth projects and, as there are no specific facilities on Pirbright camp for young people, they agreed that money could go to the local community for this

purpose. On Tuesdays an after-school youth group for school years 5-8 is held from 3.30 to 5.30pm when around 30 young people come to play games, do crafts and chat to each other. Messy Church sessions for families are also held once a month. As you can imagine, the noise in the hall was deafening until the ceiling was done! Some of the grant will also go towards new equipment for the youth sessions. As well as St Saviour's Pre-School, the hall now regularly hosts several types of fitness, music and dance sessions. Many thanks to everyone who helped to get this local hall up to scratch and fit to be used by all.

REMEMBRANCE CENTENARY – BROOKWOOD AND PIRBRIGHT REMEMBER

Brookwood and Pirbright commemorated this special day in several ways last month with events happening in both villages and Brookwood Cemetery. Thankfully the rain held off that morning for the ceremonies held at the war graves attended by hundreds of people, including soldiers, civilians, Scouts, Guides and parents. In Pirbright, St Michael and All Angels' bells rang out before and after the church service with the traditional muffles attached to the clappers to create a distinctive echoing sound. St Saviour's Church held an exhibition over the weekend with displays by Brookwood Art Group, Brookwood School and Pre-School, and local people brought in photographs, stories, poems, medals and artefacts, including a drum used by the 33rd Battalion Manchester Machine Gun Corps, and two Bibles with shrapnel holes in them, which saved the lives of their owners, as they were always carried in the left breast pocket of their uniform. The stories behind the names of Brookwood soldiers on the plaque at the Memorial Hall were displayed too. At 7pm, when the guns fell silent 100 years ago, a beacon was lit near Lord Pirbright's Hall and the church bells rang out once again, joining in with a county-wide initiative to commemorate the moment in this way. The hall also had a display of local soldiers who had lost their lives and their histories researched by Pirbright Local History Society.

POSSIBLE STATION CHANGES

There has been much speculation recently over the possible closure of the entrance to the train station from the cemetery. A recent email from the Managing Director of South Western Railway (SWR) has tried to ease concerns and fully share possible plans. There are many things to consider in updating our station, but at the moment they are trying to make it clear that the entrance will not be blocked, merely updated and manned. This will increase the hours that the station as a whole is manned, and reduce people using that entrance and not buying tickets. This is very much an ongoing process and it appears that no firm decisions have yet been made. If you have any thoughts and opinions on this, please contact SWR to share them.
