

FUTURE FLIGHT PATHS OVER BROOKWOOD

Heathrow have begun a public consultation process about changes to their future operations and their use of airspace. These changes are likely to affect aircraft flight paths over Brookwood from 2022 onwards, possibly increasing the level of aircraft noise that we experience. The potential construction of a third runway at Heathrow will be a major cause of these changes, but a new method of controlling aircraft flight paths is also being introduced, which will change the traditional take-off and landing routes.

Heathrow have put on a series of public

exhibitions which explain why and how the flight paths and aircraft operations will change. Our local exhibition was at West End village hall on Saturday 16 February. You can find all the documents, information and a questionnaire on their website (<https://afo.heathrowconsultation.com/>) if you missed the exhibition.

Once they have gathered the public feedback from the exhibitions and questionnaires, they will present their specific proposals in June this year. So now is your chance to have a say before the plans firm up!



BROOKWOOD CEMETERY – RECENT DEVELOPMENTS



been done and last year it won an award for the best large cemetery in the country.

Some 350m (10%) of the cemetery boundary wall was structurally unsound and work was begun on rebuilding it to modern design standards with special coping bricks purpose-made to match the originals. Unfortunately, the use of peak hour traffic lights on the A322 has been delayed by UK Power Networks' emergency work and by winter weather. So the decision was taken to stop the cemetery wall work and recommence in the spring.

A contract for new signage including notice boards, signposting and interpretation panels has recently been let, and these will start to appear in the cemetery around Easter time.

Additional brown highways signs are being put up to direct drivers from Aldershot to the appropriate cemetery entrance.

A contract for the restoration of the Colquhoun chapel within the cemetery has also been let to a specialist restoration company and this will start in April. In addition, staff facilities have been improved and upgraded, and new digital CCTV system has been installed. Finally, a planning consultancy has been appointed and is producing a masterplan for the cemetery, which should be complete by late summer. This will help the cemetery in attracting further funding from groups such as the Heritage Lottery Fund.

BROOKWOOD SCHOOL

We have had a very busy time at Brookwood School since Christmas. Around 20 new children have joined us since the start of the year from the UK and further afield, bringing interesting new life experiences and stories.

As well as working very hard on maths, English and the wider curriculum, we continue to provide a varied range of activities in school. As an example, we are very proud that all our 9–11 year olds are taught to play chess through a weekly session. This encourages tactical thinking, and many of our children are now pursuing this to a high standard.

We were thrilled to be able to take our choir to London by train earlier this month to sing with 8,000 other children at the O2 Arena. Organised by a team called Young Voices, the choir practised pieces in school and transferred them into a stunning concert. In addition, nearly 100 of our older children took the train for a matinee of Grease by The Winston Churchill School at the Rhoda McGaw Theatre. Prior to both these visits we were pleased to welcome Network Rail staff into school to discuss rail safety, reinforcing messages we regularly share with our children in order to keep them safe while we travel to these activities.

Closer to home, our Forest School team now has a dry space where the children can gather in the very worst of the weather. We are just about to start a potato growing competition between different groups in school.

On a sadder note, we were devastated that the school has been targeted by vandals recently. Some of the windows installed at great expense by Surrey County Council have been stripped of lead. This has caused significant water leaks and we now face more disruption. We are currently inviting people who can make a regular commitment of an hour or more a week to work with children in school. Of course, we have to run safeguarding checks on regular volunteers but, if this would interest you, I'd be delighted to hear from you.

THE BASINGSTOKE CANAL – SUPPORT NEEDED

The fortunes of the Basingstoke Canal are very much dependent on the funds available to the owners (Surrey and Hampshire County Councils). In today's climate of cuts there is a real pressure on the resources that can be allocated to the canal. Since the canal was reopened in 1991 there have been periods when funding restrictions meant that expenditure on the canal was cut back, resulting in the canal not always being fully open to navigation. We need your support to prevent that.

The funding issues for the current owners have led them to consider other ways of assuring the maintenance and capital expenditure on the canal. One possible solution involved talks with the Canal & River Trust (C&RT), a charitable trust that owns and operates 2,000 miles of waterways in the UK, to take over the canal. The C&RT does not have to juggle its funding priorities in the same way as county and local authorities, so this would provide a stable future for the canal. Unfortunately the discussions have ceased, at least for a few years. The main issue is money. Both sides agree that the transfer of the canal must also



involve the transfer of a capital sum from the current owners to the C&RT, but the amount that C&RT is looking for is in excess of what the counties wish to pay. The figures are significant – tens of millions. Contact the BCS
