END-OF-YEAR SCHOOL REPORT



We have had an extremely successful, if busy, year at Brookwood School. It started with an Ofsted Inspection on days 5 and 6 of our term, and frankly, hasn't stopped since.

Our teachers have planned and delivered vital core English and Maths lessons each morning so that the children become highly proficient in the extensive curriculum which they now face in primary schools. Afternoons are then handed over to broader aspects of learning where we link the additional national curriculum subjects into projects. These projects are wide ranging, and challenge the children to question, explore, investigate, interrogate, negotiate and communicate as they learn more about particular topics. I am sure that many readers will have seen our children around the village as part of our Forest School, a vital part of our curriculum in which every child participates every year. Throughout, we develop the knowledge, skills and values which robust learners need to ensure success in their education beyond our school, and which equip them as local, national and global citizens. This is a huge challenge, one to which we rise on a daily basis. Ofsted agreed – acknowledging that the school delivers a great education to every pupil, particularly in the quality of our Early Years

provision, in Personal Development and Welfare and in Behaviour – all of which were judged to be Outstanding.

As with all schools, we face challenges in managing within the increasingly tight budgets set by the Government. We are told that there is more money than ever being spent in education, but on the front line schools have seen a huge increase in baseline costs and an average real-terms decrease of 8% in funding. At Brookwood, we choose not to ask parents to 'top-up' our funds, preferring to live within our means. I am very pleased to say that, as an academy, we have to, and can, prove that we remain viable for a full 5 years.

As with all things, change is inevitable – and there are changes to note in school. After 11 years in post, I will be leaving at the end of term to take a role within the Executive Team at the Bourne Education Trust of which Brookwood School is part. Mr David Gunning, the current Deputy Headteacher, will be the new Head of School. He has exciting plans for the future – so watch this space! It has been a pleasure and a privilege to work with the Governors, staff, pupils, parents and friends of Brookwood School over the past years, but I leave the school in robust health academically, financially and in terms of its broader community. I am sure that Mr Gunning will feel as much a part of village life as I have. Thank you to you all for your support for me and the school.




SUMMER FAIR
