# STATION UPDATE



We're sure that you'll all have seen the work going on at the station. The plan is to block the old front entrance to the station and everyone coming to the village will pass through the gates in the ticket hall in front of Tony-the-Ticket's office and out of the new entrance. SWR say that there will be a Gateline Assistant (a real person) available at the gates between 6am and 10pm. When there is no assistant available, the gates will be left open.

The door to the cemetery will be replaced by an iron gate which will close on a magnetic

lock. It will be fitted with an intercom system and controlled by the Gateline Assistant. As now, the cemetery exit will be closed between 10pm and 6am.

Work is due to be completed later this month and Tony asks for customers' patience. There will almost certainly be teething problems with the new system, but it will need to run for a few weeks in order for SWR to identify and deal with them. In roughly the same timescale, SWR will also be introducing Automatic Number Plate Recognition (APNR) and changing the way daily and weekly car parking tickets are sold. These tickets will be available online, by phone or from the machines but not from the ticket office. After paying for your parking, you won't have to display a ticket in your car. Season tickets for parking will however continue to be sold at the ticket office.
