## BROOKWOOD CEMETERY – DOUBLE GOOD NEWS

The cemetery has received a silver accolade at the national Cemetery of the Year Awards in the 'Large Cemetery' category.

Woking Borough Council acquired the 220 acre site in 2014, and has implemented an extensive programme of restoration in order to return the Grade 1 listed park and garden to its former glory. The cemetery manager has said that the transformation isn't just about its appearance, but is about opening up the space to the community and making people more aware of the diversity and wealth of history within its walls.

At this time of remembrance, it is worth noting that twelve recipients of the Victoria Cross rest there with a further three commemorated.

The other good news is that a 'lost' Victorian chapel, which had been discovered in the undergrowth, has now been restored over the past five months.

It was built in the Gothic style by the Colquhoun family in 1858 as their mausoleum, but effectively disappeared behind shrubs and rhododendrons after the 1930s. By reviewing historical images of the cemetery, the chapel's existence was found and concerted efforts in the back woods finally led to it being



located in a poor state of repair. Having been discovered, major work was undertaken by a specialist conservation surveyor, stonemasons and a blacksmith.

Still with the cemetery, the Brookwood Cemetery Society will be organising the first

monthly walk of the season on Sunday 3 November. "The Boundary Walk" starts from the Glades of Remembrance car park at 2pm. Stout shoes are recommended.

The next programme of walks will start on Sunday 1 March 2020.
