
## DOMESTIC ABUSE SUPPORT

# SAVE NHS WOKING PETITION

Following an enquiry to Woking Borough Council regarding the Save Woking NHS Petition, one of our Brookwood News editors recently received an email response, summarised below, together with links to relevant information on Woking Borough Council website.



The petition was discussed by the Council's Executive on 6 February, under 'Urgent Business' and it was agreed that the Leader of the Council will write to the Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) to outline the concerns of the Council and residents. It was also agreed that following officers' investigations they should report to the meeting of the Executive on 26 March 2020. ## Social prescribing

Philippa Secretan from Woking Borough Council is providing a new service to our patients on a Wednesday morning.

A Social Prescribing Link Worker will offer people one to one appointments either at your home or in the surgery to talk to you about concerns and factors affecting your health. The Link Worker will then help to identify and organise suitable assistance via their network of known services, local community and voluntary organisations.

## Extended access appointments

The following appointments at Woking Community Hospital can be booked via the surgery reception:

- on the day evening and advance Saturday morning GP appointments
- Saturday morning wound dressing and phlebotomy (over 16)
- evening smear appointments.

First contact physiotherapy assessment appointments can be booked via reception for adults – these can be at several of our local GP practices.
