Woking Borough Council has been figuring out how best to support the community and businesses during this unprecedented time. Critical services have been identified and contingency plans have been put into place. Unfortunately, much of the cultural programme of events, including Party in the Park, have been cancelled to allow staff to be redirected to the front line. SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL HELPLINE

Surrey County Council has set up a Community Helpline (0300 2001008). Its purpose is to help direct residents who need support. It also aims to provide advice to residents on where they can register to volunteer. It is launched alongside Surrey's public information campaign around five key things for people to do during the Coronavirus outbreak:

- 1) Keeping up to date and following the official advice at www.nhs.uk/coronavirus
- 2) Sharing only official information and guidance from trusted sources – not spreading rumour or panic
- 3) Staying sensible – washing hands regularly, keeping physical distance from each other
- 4) Thinking about what help you need or how you can help
- 5) Making sure we keep in touch with each other – phone, text, Facetime, just checking in

BROOKWOOD MEMORIAL HALL

At present, Brookwood Memorial Halls plans to stay open for small gatherings willing to follow public health guidelines on self-isolation, social distancing and self sanitisation. The Halls will be cleaned once daily and have adequate soap and paper stocks, but no alcohol sanitiser. WORD OF WARNING

With everyone pulling together and helping each other, we will get through this period in our lives safely. However, please stay alert to the few people who will try to take advantage of the situation. If someone offers to do your shopping, unless it is someone you know well and trust, do not give them your bank card, pin number or cash. Genuine helpers will not mind you paying them at a later date when you are well enough or are able to get some money.

Please take every precaution to keep yourself safe, wash your hands regularly and, if you are helping someone else, only leave items on the doorstep. It is also recommended that shopping packaging is disinfected or double-bagged and tightly closed, and that you use gloves wherever possible, taking away the outer bag yourself.
