BASINGSTOKE CANAL 'KEY FOR COMMUNITY WELLBEING'

The Basingstoke Canal Society is starting a new fundraising drive to enhance the environment of the canal following a leap in user numbers since the outbreak of Covid-19.

According to the Basingstoke Canal Authority, which represents Surrey County Council and Hampshire County Council as owners of the canal, around three times the usual number of visitors are enjoying the waterway, taking part in everything from paddle boarding, walking and cycling to fishing, boating and wildlife photography. Although many more people are enjoying the health and wellbeing benefits of time spent at the canal, the Basingstoke Canal Society, which has acted as guardian to the canal since its restoration, says that it needs more people to become aware of the charitable status, how it is funded, and how they can

contribute to its upkeep through membership and donations.

Phase 1 of the initiative aims to raise £20,000 for 10 new information signs. The signs will be placed along the 32-mile waterway, designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) by Natural England, and feature key points of interest, the local history of that stretch, and maps marking car parks, villages and the ways and rules for enjoying the space in a respectful way. GOODBYE GEOFF – A CELEBRATION OF HIS LIFE IN THE VILLAGE

Sue and Sophie are saddened to announce the sudden and unexpected passing of Geoff Hobbs on Friday 2 October. Geoff was born in Bermondsey in 1951 and grew up in South London, meeting Sue at a darts match in 1981. They moved to Brookwood in 1988 and were delighted when daughter Sophie arrived in 1990.

From then on, Geoff's life changed in so many ways, following redundancy and a decision to become a full-time house Dad. He was often the only Dad to regularly attend Baby Swim and Toddler Group, where he took great delight in dragging the children round St Saviour's Hall on a parachute whilst the other volunteers quietly tidied away the chaos.

As Sophie grew, so did Geoff's involvement in village life, and he became a familiar

sight walking Sophie to Brookwood School and chatting with the mums at the school gate. For many years, he was responsible for ticket sales and 'front of house' duties at the numerous Brookwood Children's Drama Group productions. He was also a guest Santa for Toddler Group, St Saviour's Pre-School and Brookwood Primary School, where he earned a degree of notoriety for being the only gent known to have removed his trousers in the headmistress's office, and for having the said headmistress sitting on his knee whilst asking the class if she had been good that year!

Geoff also volunteered at FOBS events, including manning the roller coaster and the coconut shy at the Winter Fete. He was responsible for re-instigating the Beer Tent at the School Summer Fete, aided by John, Nick and Bernard and his other close friends in the village, often dressing up to join in the theme of the fete. Many people remember the 'Happy Hippy Bar' and 'Hal's' space-themed bar in 2001 and of enjoying their real ale and chats there.

When Sophie moved on to Winston Churchill School, Geoff returned to work, as Finance Manager at Hagthorne Cottage Nursery in Bisley. Here he formed strong friendships with Richard Bos and the team there, whilst combining his love of horticulture with his financial acumen. He also found more time to tend the allotment on Sheets Heath, which he had for 20 years since the site opened. Many people remember their passing chats at Plot 9 and their envy at this plot being one of the few to have a water butt!

Geoff also became an active member of Brookwood Club, serving on the committee for 17 years and being Treasurer for 12. He was also the club's resident bingo caller, often causing confusion and hilarity with his unique style of bingo calling: 'how many dozen is that Alex?!'

Following their retirements in 2017, Geoff and Sue spent their time between Brookwood, their beloved Cornwall, and Sophie's home in Derby, where there were always gardening tasks to take on.

Many people have reminisced on Geoff's fondness to chat to everyone he knew or met, whether discussing the fortunes of his esteemed Millwall with fellow footie fans, making a point of welcoming new club members, or just bumping into people in the street or in Sainsburys.

Geoff will be sadly missed by all who knew him, and we have been deeply touched by the many condolences we have received since his untimely departure. His private (and Covid-restricted) funeral will be taking place on Friday 6 November at 1pm at Woking Crematorium.

ST SAVIOUR'S CHURCH UPDATE

Some of you may have noticed that for some weeks now there have been a skip and a large van outside the church. After seven years of fundraising and applying for permission and grants, the vestry is finally being given a makeover, with a new toilet installed and a wide door from the church where the organ used to be. Thank you everyone who supported the concerts and events held at the church over this period, as you have helped to achieve this. It will mean easier access to facilities when the hall is occupied and when it's raining!



Because the organ has been removed, there are 600 pipes available and looking for a home. We are offering the organ pipes as keep-sakes to locals for a small donation which will be put towards the church renovations. They make great bird feeders, owl boxes, shelving or garden ornaments – you can be quite inventive... Small lead pipes (remember that lead is poisonous), medium zinc pipes and large wooden pipes are available. Contact Sue Kaufman on 07971 639951 to reserve (on first come first served basis).

Over the summer months, the church was used for some socially distanced services, but due to the small area, only 15 people could attend, so services are now being held instead at Holy Trinity, Knaphill, where there is more room. Meanwhile, St Saviour's will be closed until further notice.

Some good news is that a new Youth and Young Adults Leader has been appointed this summer. His name is Pete Hewlett and he lives in Woking with his wife Miriam and their new baby, Caleb. He knows the churches and area well, and we are looking forward to welcoming him into the community once restrictions allow.

BROOKWOOD CHRISTMAS FOODBANK COLLECTION – CAN YOU HELP?


An appeal by Trudi & Darren:

What a very strange year it has been with Covid-19 and lockdown. These two combined elements have resulted in an unprecedented rise in service users to Woking Foodbank. We have given much thought as to whether to run the campaign this year due to Covid, but we have decided to push ahead with it as our local communities need our help more than ever this year. Woking Foodbank have been adapting to the new government rules and delivering lots of food parcels to the elderly, those who have been shielding for health reasons, and those with little or no income due to being furloughed or indeed having been made redundant.

The campaign will commence on 28 October and finish on 5 December. If you can help in any way with non-perishable items that would be fantastic, or alternatively a cash donation. The cash may be used to purchase non-perishables or indeed put towards paying the rent on their new premises.

If you would like to provide a food parcel, please attach a label with your name and address so we can thank you personally. Drop-off points are currently Brookwood Club and also Bakers Dozen/Post Office during working hours, both within the village.

I know we had lots of companies involved last year which was amazing, and indeed if you would like to get involved again this year please do let us know. I will be undertaking regular radio interviews with Radio Woking again, based at Winston Churchill School, so I am more than happy to



promote your business through all variations of social media throughout the campaign.
