THE WOKING PEREGRINE PROJECT

High above Woking's town centre, at the top of Export House, there is being enacted a daily drama guaranteed to grab the attention of even the most disinterested TV soap viewer.



Peregrine falcons have regularly graced the skies above Woking for the last fifteen years and they have been successfully breeding since a nest box was installed in January 2016. There are four webcams located close to the box and via www.wokingperegrines.com these allow viewers to follow the breeding season over several months, from the first appearance of the eggs, usually in mid-March, through the entire cycle to fledging and departure of the juveniles from the nest later in summer. The site provides a fascinating, yet educational "must watch" distraction for all the family, regardless of whether or not lockdown is in place.

THE ROADMAP FOR LIFTING LOCKDOWN

By the time this edition is delivered we will know how successful the Government's plans for lifting lockdown restrictions from 29 March have been, and whether stage two of the roadmap, starting on 12 April, is realistic. BROOKWOOD CHRISTMAS FOODBANK



You may recall we collected lots of food parcels and cash donations over the Christmas period for our Woking Foodbank appeal and we are very pleased to advise that those funds will continue to support Woking Foodbank with essential supplies over the coming months. We have in the month of March made a further distribution, and during these unprecedented times the foodbank had a huge increase in service users as below:

- 2,421 food vouchers were issued;
- the average number of Woking households supported with food deliveries every week since lockdown began on 23 March 2020 was 52; and
- 5,969 adults and children in Woking were provided with a 3-day emergency food supply in 2020.

We are very proud to support this campaign and once again thank you all for your generosity in what continues to be a very difficult time; we are pleased to have been able to help local families. WOKING RESIDENTS' PANEL

Woking Borough Council are seeking assistance in connection with their plan to establish the Woking Residents' Panel. This will consist of 1,000 residents representative of the borough. The only requirements are that all panellists must be aged 18 or over, a resident of Woking borough and enthusiastic about participating in local democracy. Panellists are not required to have any prior knowledge, skills or expertise, and will not be expected to demonstrate any specific abilities before participating.

Panellists will be contacted several times a year for their views on a variety of issues, projects and services that the Council provides. The Council aspires to have a panel that is fully representative of Woking's different communities, to ensure they achieve a balanced view on topics the Council wishes to consult on.

A reminder that on Thursday 6 May elections will be held to elect councillors to Surrey County Council and Woking Borough Council, as well as choosing a Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Surrey.

The Borough Council and PCC elections have been rearranged following last year's postponement due to coronavirus. This year, there is no voter ID pilot, so voters will not require photographic identification when voting. The list of candidates standing for all elections will be published on Friday 9 April. The Community Hall at Brookwood Memorial Halls will be used as the polling station.

Polling stations will be safe places to vote. Cleaning, personal protective equipment and social distancing measures will be in place to ensure voters' safety and the safety of polling station staff. Voters are requested to bring their own pen or pencil to mark their ballot paper, if possible.

JUST GET MOVING – REMINDER

A reminder that on Friday 23 April and over the weekend of 24–25 April, FOBS, Friends of Brookwood School, are organising 'Just Get Moving'. Children in Brookwood School are being encouraged to run 2km on Friday at school, with friends, family and members of the local community seeing how far they can run, walk or cycle over the weekend. Route, speed and timings are down to the participants. FOBS ask only that distances travelled are emailed to

them so that they can total them all.

BROOKWOOD MILITARY CEMETERY

You may have seen the recent article on BBC news about the story of the forgotten agent, a 98-year-old veteran and a golden engagement ring, but if not, follow this link (www.bbc.co.uk/news/stories-56215177) and all will be revealed. The Commonwealth War Graves Commission were contacted last year by a researcher who noted that Lt Marcel Leccia was commemorated by his wartime alias Lt Georges Louis. Thanks to the supporting evidence, the CWGC have been able to change their records to reflect this and their specialist stonemasons will soon hand engrave this amendment into the panels on the Brookwood 1939–1945

Memorial, where he is commemorated.

The CWGC receive thousands of submissions each year to amend errors or omissions in their records. Each case must be carefully considered and, where the evidence supports, they are able to make changes to their records, which can quickly be reflected in the CWGC online database. Reflecting these changes on a headstone or memorial takes a little longer. Because of the volume of amendments their stonemasons must assess each case and look at whether it is possible to re-engrave in situ, or whether a new headstone or memorial panel is needed.


BROOKWOOD ART GROUP

BROOKWOOD MEMORIAL HALLS

Brookwood Memorial Halls are re-opening, though operations will be in accordance with the Government's roadmap and subject to any rule changes. Covid-secure practices will be observed until no longer needed, daily cleans and wipedowns of all frequently touched surfaces will be carried out and kitchen servery facilities remain limited. Hires are still subject to social distancing, capacity limits, Test and Trace recording, and cleaning equipment used. For details, rates, online booking availability and online booking requests please see www.bmhalls.org.uk, or email enquiries to lettings@bmhalls.org.uk.

Key dates and permitted activities are as follows:

12 April – organised children's activities, including dance classes and sport, can resume; parent and child groups (up to 15 people plus under-5s) can meet.

17 May – adult indoor group sports and exercise classes can resume; wakes, wedding receptions and life events such as christenings can be hosted, with restrictions, up to 30 people; social groups up to 6 people or two households can meet indoors.

21 June – "all legal limits on social contact will be removed." Some measures such as distancing, capacities and face coverings may still be required. The Committee plans to host large social gatherings, with a deep clean afterwards, only once all adults have been offered a first vaccination, which currently is expected from 31 July.



ST SAVIOUR'S CHURCH

Sadly, St Saviour's Church will not be open for Easter because of the limited capacity to seat people in a Covid-safe way while restrictions are still in place. Hopefully the church will be able to open again after June.
