COUNTRY PARK FIELD

Recently Traveller ponies have been grazing on land within the country park running alongside the canal in Brookwood. Whilst this location is preferable to other areas the ponies have been grazing recently, it's still illegal grazing.

Cllr Kevin Davis has been working with officers to achieve a licensing scheme that will enable a different field in that area that has road access via the A322 to be used for ponies. This work is ongoing.

Vehicles have been seen being driven along the footpath to access the ponies and this is beyond unacceptable. The path has not been designed for vehicles, the two bridges are not maintained and may

not hold up structurally to vehicles, and it's clearly dangerous to other users of the path.

Kevin met up with officers last month to work out the best way of preventing the vehicle access. This is urgently being addressed and Kevin is expecting solid posts to be installed in the middle of the path at the entrance by the pavilion at the Knaphill end, and also from the canal. These will likely be made from wood, with sufficient reflective markings to prevent collisions. Access will still be possible for double-width buggies.

The RAW is on! We are racing around the world to raise funds for much-needed IT equipment for our wonderful school. Our pupils are


walking, running, cycling, scooting, swimming, hopping or even dancing their way across the world.




FUNDS COLLECTED FOR A CHURCH IN NEED IN BULGARIA

Our trust's treasurer, Elena Matthews, brought to our attention the need for

a church in her native Bulgaria for help with heating costs. At her request we sent round an appeal for the church, Saint Xenia of Petersburg Orthodox Church, in Varna, on 31 May, and within two weeks, our parishioners and friends had donated a total of £3,300. Elena herself has collected another £400, and people on our emailing list, living abroad, have assured us that they will send donations from their countries to Saint Xenia's. Apparently, the parish priest of the Varna Church, Fr Peter Dimitrov, broke into tears when Elena told him how much had been collected in such a short time. We thank all of you who have contributed. May God's blessings be your reward.

BROOKWOOD SCHOOL UPDATE

As we edge closer to the end of the academic year, we are reflecting on the successes and achievements we have enjoyed as a school.

Firstly, we have worked incredibly hard to keep children, staff and families safe as we adapt to new rules and procedures. Health and wellbeing has remained the greatest priority but we are very proud of the progress the children have made despite all of the challenges they have faced. While we greatly miss being able to operate in our usual way and felt the frustrations of the disruptions caused, there are many things we have learned, improved and will do differently as a result of the pandemic. In particular, the use of technology has moved forward significantly this year, and this was reflected in the high quality of remote learning delivered through the partial school closure.

Furthermore, part of my vision for the school is to ensure we are the first-choice school within the area, and raise standards of the learning environments as well as teaching and learning. I am delighted that we are once again oversubscribed for our Reception Class

The four classrooms and communal areas in Key Stage 2 have been fully refurbished and our brand new Wellbeing Centre will be ready to launch in September. These are just two examples of the extensive work being carried out and I look forward to updating you further on future projects.




WE WILL REMEMBER OUR WAR HEROES



The Brookwood Last Post Association is probably one of Brookwood's best kept secrets – they even say so themselves on their website (<https://brookwoodlastpost.org/the-last-post/>)!

The Brookwood Last Post Association meet on the first Sunday of the month at 3pm in front of the RAF Memorial in Brookwood Cemetery. They hold a short service, and a parade of Standards to honour the fallen in the two World Wars and the many war engagements since. They would be delighted if you could spare an hour or so once a month to join them.

Remarkably they are celebrating their 80th anniversary this year at their usual monthly meeting on Sunday 4 July 2021 at 3–3.30 pm, RAF Memorial, Brookwood Military Cemetery. The Mayor of Woking, the Belgian Defence Attaché, Members of Woking Borough Council and Senior Officers of Woking Borough Council have been invited.

The provisional plans for the ceremony are as follows:

Parade – Led by the Gordon's School Pipes and Drums

Welcome

Bidding

Individual Remembrances – Eight named members of the armed forces will be remembered, one from each of the six founding countries of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission – United Kingdom, Canada, South Africa, Australia, New Zealand and India – along with a Belgian due to the link with Ypres, and one member of the United States armed forces in conjunction with the American Battle Monuments Commission.

The history of the Brookwood Last Post Association is connected to the Last Post Association in Ypres in France. Following the end of World War One the chief of police in Ypres wanted the Menin Gate to be a memorial and a place of living remembrance where the lives of the fallen from the Battle of Passchendaele (Third Battle of Ypres) would be saluted each day. The sounding of 'The Last Post' and 'Reveille' by a bugler took place at the inauguration of the Menin Gate in 1927 – ten years after the Battle of Passchendaele (Third Battle of Ypres).

During World War Two and the occupation of Ypres in 1940, the Nazi authorities banned the service and tried to confiscate the bugles. Unfortunately, they had already been buried somewhere and couldn't be found!

Mr Edgar Ashley Cook, MBE, a successful Woking businessman (and a WWI veteran) heard about this and was upset by the stoppage. Together with a group of friends, he formed an organisation to replicate the Ypres service and the Surrey Last Post Association was born.

The first service was held in Brookwood Cemetery in January 1941. Despite the difficulties of those dark days, the service was held as regularly as possible for the next four years.

On the very day when Ypres was liberated by Polish troops on 6 September 1944, the bugles were dug

up, dusted off and once again echoed under the Menin Gate arches. Therefore, the need for the ceremony at Brookwood was over – but not the desire to keep those memories alive and so the services continued here.

Sometime during the 1950s and 1960s, official support was discontinued and the name changed from the Surrey Last Post to the Brookwood Last Post Association. Over the years, the ceremony has continued though the membership has changed as those who are left grow old. In 2010, there was a visit from the Last Post Association in Ypres who sent a delegation of Standard Bearers and a joint parade was held. Members of the Brookwood Last Post Association last visited Ypres as part of the 75th Anniversary of the liberation of Ypres in 2019.

The Brookwood Last Post Association rely on fundraising and individual memberships. Membership costs £10 per calendar year and helps with the administration costs including public liability insurance and website fees.
