SOUTH WESTERN RAILWAY CHANGE TO PEAK SERVICE

SWR have confirmed that off-peak tickets travelling towards London are valid on any service arriving at London Waterloo from 10am. As the 9.16am service from Brookwood is scheduled to arrive in Waterloo at 9.59am, this is classified as a peak service. The first off-peak service from Brookwood is scheduled to depart at 9.53am and arrive in Waterloo at 10.34am.

Some residents have contacted SWR Customer Services to say that the least they could do is to apply off-peak concessions to the 9.16. Let's hope it happens.

SAFE ROUTE PIRBRIGHT-BROOKWOOD



The petition has now received over 630 signatures and we have received 50 responses and counting from the community sharing their experiences of the route and current issues. SCC councillor and the highways team have agreed to add improvement works to the list, but the project needs to make the top 20 of over 60 countywide projects. The decision will be made by

WOKING RAILWAY STATION

Planned essential repair work to the public underpass at Woking Railway Station is due to begin at the end of January. The works, carried out by Woking Borough Council in partnership with Network Rail and South Western Railway, mean it is necessary to close the underpass from Monday 24 January 2022 for 8 weeks. Works include replacing damaged and loose stairs, in addition to general maintenance and improvements to the underpass.

A signed diversion route will be in operation

throughout this period via High Street, Victoria Way and Station Approach.

We would like to thank local commuters and residents for their patience and cooperation during these important works and apologise for any inconvenience to their journey.

REPLACING KITTY: AN EXHIBITION OF CANAL ARTWORK

This special exhibition will reveal the beauty of the Basingstoke Canal through artists' eyes. Showcasing the best works by national and local artists inspired by the Basingstoke Canal, it is coming to The Lightbox gallery and museum next month, organised by Brookwood resident Gren Gale on behalf of the Basingstoke Canal Society.

Opening on Tuesday 22 February, the exhibition will run for 2 weeks and feature pieces from a number of local artists, as well as popular painter and printmaker Ian Mowforth, and Cranleigh artist Mark Weighton, whose sculpture Burnt Wood was produced for COP26.

The exhibition forms part of the Basingstoke

Canal Society's fundraising campaign to replace its ageing community trip boat and secure a more eco-friendly future for the waterway.

Plans include the introduction of a new solar-electric cruise boat, as well as the installation of charging points along the canal in Woking to mark the first step towards making the canal fully electric for all users.

The new, more environmentally friendly Kitty II and electrification project will cost around £200,000, and the Society has already raised nearly £100,000 towards the target. Kick-starting the fund with £70,000 from its own reserves, the Society ran a crowdfunding campaign in the run-up to Christmas, adding

£14,627 to the pot. A further £15,000 has come in from individual and corporate donations, bequests and grants.

The exhibition will be opened by Woking MP Jonathan Lord at 11am on Tuesday 22 February.

Art lovers will be able to view the exhibition from 10.30am to 5pm on weekdays and Saturdays, and 11am to 4pm on Sundays, until Sunday 6 March. Entry is free, with a suggested donation of £3. Every artwork on display will be available to buy, with all proceeds going towards the new, more accessible and sustainable Kitty II.


BROOKWOOD PERSON OF THE YEAR AWARD

Omicron Hospitality & Leisure Grant

Eligible businesses can now apply for the Omicron Hospitality and Leisure Grant

Woking Borough Council has secured further government funding to support businesses severely affected by the spread of the Omicron variant. The Omicron Hospitality and Leisure grant scheme payment is a one-off payment which is applicable to:

- Business rated businesses – you receive a business rate bill.
- The applicant must be the rate payer named on the business rates bill.
- The Omicron Hospitality and Leisure scheme will provide one-off grants of up to £6,000.

The deadline for online applications for the Omicron Hospitality and Leisure Grant is 13 February 2022. Successful applications will be paid as soon as possible and final payments will be made by 31 March 2022.
