BROOKWOOD PRIMARY SCHOOL

The month of May is all about 'Moving' at Brookwood Primary School. Similar to this time last year, we are launching our 'Just Move' event, aimed at the whole of Brookwood community. Together with our Friends of Brookwood School (FOBS) team, we are aiming to bring the community together to run, walk, swim or cycle to improve our physical and mental health. As well as encouraging fitness and togetherness, we are asking the school and wider community to consider donating towards our Library Project. While the children have bounced back after a challenging 2 years through Covid-19 and are making excellent progress in school, we want to help the children recover from school closures and missed opportunities by developing our curriculum and improving reading at Brookwood. Our aim is to do this by transforming our school library into a multi-purpose room to really reflect our new curriculum. In addition, we want to develop our reading areas in school and develop an outdoor library. This is an incredibly ambitious project, but we hope with the support of the school and wider community we could raise £10,000 to make an enormous difference to our children's education.


MAPPING THE OLD CEMETERY RAILWAY LINE



The old dismantled cemetery railway line ran from Brookwood railway station, outside platform 2 with short section remaining, past a North station near Long Avenue. It continued to the old South station where St Edwards Brotherhood Monastery now stands.

Young villager Aaran Harle-Hosein (aged 6) and his dad recently explored the old track route. Aaran created this map, to help others follow the route. Aaran was rewarded for his efforts by a tour of the little known London Necropolis Railway exhibit within the monastery, kindly hosted by the brotherhood.

SAINT EDWARD BROTHERHOOD

On Saturday 4 April, new gates were installed at the entrance to our property, replacing the old bar which had been irretrievably broken. It being the Platinum Jubilee year of Her Majesty the Queen, we ordered 'Jubilee' gates. They were custom-made and installed by Wesson Fencing, a firm which used to be centred in Brookwood village, but is now working from Chobham. They did an excellent job.

On 20 April we were able to send £300 to His Eminence Metropolitan Agafangel, the presiding hierarch of the continuing Synod of Bishops of the Russian Orthodox Church Abroad, for the help of our churches in Ukraine, and received a thank-you from him.
