PLANS FOR BROOKWOOD LYE

As mentioned in our March edition, a meeting was held in the small Memorial Hall on 29 February at which the Woking Borough Council's plans for the Brookwood Lye Road site were outlined. It was well attended by local people and other interested parties, including Cllr Kevin Davis and Mike Peel who have been pushing this issue for some years. The leader of WBC, Cllr Ann-Marie Barker, gave an introduction. The WBC Interim Strategic Director (Place), Beverley Kuchar, then described the ownership of the various parts of the site, the planning permissions, the planning enforcements and the proposed way forward. This provoked many questions and much discussion from the audience, all resolved satisfactorily. Mr Mark Rolt, the CEO

of ThamesWey, then outlined the affordable housing development plan currently being proposed for part of the site. The picture shows a view of some of the proposed housing.

It is a complex situation involving a number of parties and it is not yet fully resolved. The following description is based on the author's memory of the meeting; it should not be taken as definitive.

For simplicity, the site can be considered as four main sections, lettered A–D in the plan shown.

Section A is wholly owned by WBC and ThamesWey have prepared the current plan for the development of 57 dwellings in this section. Once it has planning permission, a developer will be selected to build the houses.

Section B is partially owned by WBC. The corner plot at the traffic lights is owned by Surrey County Council and one of the four existing houses is privately owned.



EDITORIAL

Development of this section would depend on SCC releasing its land and on the private owner being prepared to sell, which is not currently the case.

Section C is owned by WBC but a long lease was previously granted to the owner of Section D (the Travellers' site). This lease only allows for this land to be used as Traveller accommodation. The existence of this lease prevents WBC from using this section for housing development.

Section D – There is a proposed plan to expand the number of pitches in Section D to 19 permanent pitches plus one temporary, most of which are already there but which are technically illegal. The planning application for this is agreed in principle by the planning committee but needs to be signed off by the owner of the Traveller site (Section D). If the planning application is signed off, the lease held for Section C will fall away (i.e. terminate). If it is not signed off, then an enforcement order by WBC will force the use of only the 10 existing legal pitches across C and D. It is hoped the site owner will decide that 19+1 is better than 10.

In summary, if Sections B and C remain unavailable, the plan for 57 dwellings will go ahead, hoping to complete in about 3 years. If Sections B and C become available before then, potentially the 2021 plan for 128 dwellings could be revived which should be better for Brookwood in the long term.

UKRAINE CONCERT FUNDRAISER



About 100 people attended a wonderful fundraising concert held at St Saviour's Church on 24 February, marking 2 years after the Russian invasion in Ukraine. Angelina Udovychenko, a Ukrainian musician currently living in the UK, was invited to play, and we were treated to a wonderful variety of folk songs and classical piano music connected

to Ukraine and Angelina's life and memories of growing up. When war broke out, she was aged 24, staying in a city in the west of Ukraine, but it was too dangerous to return to her family and home town in the Kherson region, which is now Russian occupied. She hasn't seen her family for 2 years and communication is difficult.

During the concert, she played piano music by Debussy, Chopin, and Ukrainian composers, Kosenko and Lysenko. She also performed a beautiful piece that she had composed herself. In Ukraine she used to work as a music and English teacher, so she is now working at local schools and helping and teaching British children, as well as others who have had to flee their homes. She also volunteers and arranges music recitals to help the Ukrainian army and people who are in need.

The concert included an interview with Angelina about her life in Ukraine, as well as very moving videos and pictures while the music was being performed. Almost £3000 was raised to help provide Ukrainian soldiers with cold weather clothing and tourniquets for wounds caused by landmines. Angelina thanks everyone who attended and donated so generously.
